1. EVENT TITLE DATE & VENUE

The event shall be known as “Master of Mallala” 2017 CAMS State Championship Round 2 and will be conducted on the 10th & 11th June 2017 at Mallala Motor Sport Park South Australia.

2. ORGANISATION & STATUS

- (a) Conducted under the International Sporting Code of the FIA including Appendices, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), the Race Meeting Standing Regulations (RMSR), the South Australian “Master of Mallala” 2017 CAMS State Championship Series Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations or bulletins that may be issued.
- (b) This event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS rules, policies and procedures, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au.
- (c) Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.

4. CIRCUIT DETAILS

Length: 2.6 Kms
Direction: Clockwise
Track Density: In accordance with Mallala Motor Sport Park track licence.

5. ENTRIES

The entry fee shall be as detailed. Entry forms must be completed in full, accompanied by the entry fee and lodged with the Secretary of the Meeting. Refusal of entries shall be in accordance with NCR 83 & the relevant Category Sporting Regulations. The maximum number of entries will be 250.

Such fees shall not be refundable except -

- (a) In the case of abandonment, cancellation or postponement of the meeting, in accordance with NCR59.
- (b) In the case of competitor’s cars withdrawn by written advice to the Secretary of the Meeting no later than five days before the meeting.
- (c) Competitors from New Zealand may be eligible to enter under the Trans-Tasman Agreement. Entries from International competitors will be accepted, subject to being granted a visa from CAMS or their home ASN.

A fee of \$25 will be charged to cover administrative costs associated with a refund. Any cheque dishonoured will incur the bank fee as well as a \$25 administration fee. Entries accepted in order of receipt.

6. EVENTS

For vehicles complying with the regulations as outlined in the current CAMS manual of motor sport, and for the categories as detailed in the current "Master of Mallala" 2017 CAMS State Championship Series Regulations.

Fuel shall be in accordance with Schedule G of the CAMS manual of motor sport.

Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with the noise restrictions in the Race Meeting Standing Regulations. The Clerk of the Course shall be the Judge of Fact for noise restrictions and facts to be judged in the Race Meeting Standing Regulations.

7. RACES

It is envisaged that there will be at least 3 races for each category with the length of the races to be determined at the close of entries. Refer further regulations and final schedule. The Organisers reserve the right to combine or delete categories.

8. AWARDS

Refer "Master of Mallala" 2017 CAMS State Championship Regulations for details.

9. LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

Competitors must hold the minimum of a current CAMS level PCC licence.

10. AUTOMATIC TIMING

The organisers utilise an automatic timing system, which requires all race vehicles to be fitted with an operating Dorian DATA-1 timing transmitter anytime the race vehicle is on the track, which is the competitor's responsibility.

Data 1 transmitters are available from Dorian Industries, 6/29 Graham Court, Hoppers Crossing, VIC, 3129.

The correct transmitter number must be recorded on the entry form.

11. GARAGES & PRIVATE PRACTICE

All enquiries concerning availability of paddock garages and private practice should be directed to Mallala Motorsport Park, Telephone 8276-7744 between 10.00am and 5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

12. CREDENTIAL ALLOCATION

All Categories: 4 tickets inc. driver, 1 vehicle pass

Additional tickets: \$20 each

13. PROTESTS

Competitors are reminded of their protest rights; refer NCR Part XII of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

14. TIMES

For Documentation Times and Details, Drivers Briefing Times & Details, and Race Schedule refer to Further Regulation

15. DOCUMENTATION

Competitors are to present valid competition licence(s), CAMS-affiliated car club membership card and CAMS vehicle log book at document for verification.

16. MEDICAL

Two paramedics or two SAAS persons with advanced life support qualifications will be used. As per the current CAMS Manual, this will be advised in the Further Regulations.

17. ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
